#### **Show Rules**

All Sections and Classes are now **OPEN** (i.e. there are **NO LOCAL** Sections or Classes).

- 1 All Cups awarded at the previous show are to be returned to Karen Hardy, by Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> July. Magnolia House, Leigh, Sherborne, DT9 6HW (01935 873994).
- 2 Exhibits are to be staged between 7.30 pm and 8.30 pm on the evening before the Show or between 8.30 am and 10.30 am on the Show Day. Entry Cards will be ready to collect at the times above and are to be securely attached to the Exhibit or table beside it with blue-tac so they do not become separated from the Exhibit. The Hall must be cleared for judging at 10.30 am on the Show Day. Exhibits must not be removed before 4.30 pm on the Show Day. Items not removed will be disposed of.
- **3** Entry Forms are provided with this programme. Please complete (one for each exhibitor) and place in an envelope with the correct Entry Fees and deliver to the **Show Secretary**

- 4 Exhibit fees for all Classes are 50p entries by children (16 and under) are free of charge.
- 5 Children can enter exhibits in ANY class. AGES should be displayed ONLY in Section 4, Children.
- 6 All Exhibits must be the property of the Exhibitor. All flowers, fruit and vegetables must be the produce of his or her own garden (except in Section 2, Floral Art).
- 7 No Exhibitor is allowed more than one prize in one Class.
- 8 All exhibitors are to supply necessary plates, dishes, vases etc. Presentation is very important, so take care in your choice of plates, vases etc.
- 9 No person is allowed in the Hall during judging period, except those officially engaged.
- 10 In the Collection of Vegetables, the number of each variety must be the same as required in the individual class for a single variety.
- 11 All Root Vegetables may be cut, except Potatoes.
- 12 Prizes will be awarded, withheld or reduced according to the merits of exhibits, and such awards will be at the discretion of the Judges.
- 13 Handicraft must be the Exhibitor's own work.
- **14** The Committee does not hold itself responsible for Exhibits.
- 15 All matters not met by the Rules will be decided by the Committee.
- 16 Exhibits must NOT HAVE WON A PRIZE at this Show before.

We are lucky to have the Little Leigh Store in the village which stocks local produce and we would also encourage you to think of local hen- keepers, bee-keepers and garden produce.

Your Gingerbread Men should be accompanied by a list of ingredients highlighting where they are produced, with an approximate mileage. eg. Flour - Wessex Hungerford (58 miles), Eggs -Leigh (< 1 mile), Honey - Leigh (< 1 mile, Butter – Dorchester (7 miles).

Lemon Drizzle Cake - Recipe for Class 90 Cooking time 40-45 mins			
INGREDIENTS: 115g (4oz) Margarine 170g (6oz) Caster Sugar 170g (6oz) Self-raising flour (sifted) 4 tbsp milk	METHOD  1 Grease and line 900g (2lb) loaf tin.  2 Preheat oven to 180° C/350° F/Gas mark 4.  3 Cream together the margarine and sugar.  4 Add the eggs at little at a time and mix well.  5 Add the grated lemon rind, sifted-flour and milk and mix in gently.		
2 large / 3 medium eggs Grated rind of one lemon Crunchy Topping 85g (3oz) Caster sugar Juice of one lemon	<ul> <li>6 Spoon the mixture into the greased and lined tin and level the top</li> <li>7 Put in the oven and bake for 40-45 minutes until firm</li> <li>8 For the topping, mix the caster sugar and lemon juice together and pour over the cake as soon as it comes out of the oven.</li> <li>9 Leave in the tin until completely cold before turning out</li> </ul>


